Department of Health Implementing New Regulations

On March 1, 2022, a series of new regulations were enacted by the WA State Legislature and the Department of Health affecting every food service operator in Washington State.

The regulations carried a six-month phase in period with enforcement to begin September 1, 2022.

Recently Susan Shelton, Public Health Advisor for the Department of Health shared the new regulations with WSBPA members via Zoom.

As an attachment to this month's NewsFrame, a list of the top 10 code changes affecting your business are attached. Important you read, review with staff and begin an implementation program. Items included in the new code changes will be stressed during your next on-site inspection.

Three Highlights:

- * Your center is **REQUIRED** to have a "Certified Food Protection Manager" training and a test are **REQUIRED** through one of six accredited programs (included in the NewsFrame email).
- * Changes to temperatures when cooking poultry and meat
- * Date marking of ready-to-eat products required once packaging is open

Membership dues renewals have been distributed to WSBPA member centers as the 2022-2023 begins in September.


From BPAA Smart Buy Programs, to the WSBPA Annual Meeting, a variety of social and business activities will be held through June 2023.

Dear WSBPA Members:

As we get closer to the final day of business on October 2nd it has become apparent that Tech City Bowl in Kirkland will not be relocated or purchased locally. This means that we will be opening our center up for anyone who wants to harvest equipment or parts for their centers.

One of the key enhancements that will be available is 32 lanes of Clutch the bowling projection system. This was purchased and installed shortly before we reopened in 2020. The owners have placed a price tag on the equipment at 75K. It was purchased for 120K originally. This has done wonders for our social bowling programs. The customers truly love engaging with the system. And our competitive bowlers love the Specto system which comes with the purchase. Whoever installs this in their center will be responsible for continuing the 2 years remaining on our service contract with Clutch. But I wouldn't install or run this system without it. It comes with replacement equipment and troubleshooting for issues that arise (as anything technology is prone to do) and of course upgrades and enhancements to the software.

We also have the usual suspects like lane machines, ball returns, synthetic panels, tables, chairs and kitchen equipment as well. Could you spread the word. If anyone would like more information they can contact me for more information or to schedule a site visit.
