

**General Information: “The Invitational”**  
**WSBPA High School Varsity Championship 2020**  
**February 15-16, 2020**

An invitational singles and team championship comprised of high school bowlers in grades 9-12 residing in Washington State and bowling in a youth program at any WSBPA member center in Washington State.

Singles event for **ALL** bowlers on Saturday, February 15, 2020. 100% handicap.

Team event for **ALL** bowlers on Sunday, February 16, 200. 100% handicap.

Every bowler will bowl **BOTH** days. Bowlers may not elect to bowl just one event.

Entry fee of \$75 per bowler covers **BOTH** events (singles & team competition. \$80 entry fee if a bowler does not currently have a USBC youth membership card. Extra cost provides USBC membership.

- **Singles Championship: Saturday, February 15, 2020**
- All bowlers will roll five games of qualifications. Bowlers will move one pair of lanes to their right after each game. 100% handicap against the HIGHEST average bowler entered in the tournament.
- Competition will begin at 10:00 a.m. / check in begins at 9:00 a.m.
- Following the four game of qualifications, the top four (4) bowlers will compete in a step-ladder, single game elimination. 4<sup>th</sup> versus 3<sup>rd</sup>, winner versus 2<sup>nd</sup> etc. to determine the State Singles Champion.
- In the step-ladder finals, no individual game plus handicap may exceed 300. Should a tie exist in the step-ladder finals, a 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> frame roll-off, with handicap, will be held.
- SMART Scholarships will be awarded:
  - 1<sup>st</sup>: \$1,000
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> \$ 750
  - 3<sup>rd</sup>: \$500
  - 4<sup>th</sup>: \$250
  
- **Team Championship: Sunday, February 16, 2020**
- 5 person teams will roll five, three game, Baker matches.
- One point will be awarded for each game won and two points for each 3 game match won. Total 5 points possible per match.
- Competition will be 100% handicap against the top team average entered
- No one individual team game, plus handicap, may exceed 300. Should a tie exist after a game within a 3 game match, a 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> frame roll-off, with handicap, will be held.
- Top team emerging victorious will be crowned the 2020 Invitational State Team Champions.

- SMART Scholarships will be awarded:

- 1<sup>st</sup> place team: \$1,000 (\$200 per bowler based on 5 person team)
- 2<sup>nd</sup> place team: \$ 750 (\$150 per bowler based on a 5 person team)
- 3<sup>rd</sup> place team: \$ 500 (\$100 per bowler based on a 5 person team)
- 4<sup>th</sup> place team: \$ 250 (\$ 50 per bowler based on a 5 person team)

1. Coach or team captain must sign bottom of the recap sheets, immediately after each Baker matches before scores are officially recorded.
2. Remember to write your team name, the name of the school, or the host bowling center on the top of the recap sheets.
3. Only one bowling ball on the ball return rack for each bowler.
4. Please be respectful of others equipment by making sure you do not accidentally pick up the wrong ball when moving to the next game.
5. Saturday's schedule: Check-in: begins at 9:00 a.m. / 9:30 a.m. Coaches Meeting; 9:45 a.m. practice begins / 10:00 a.m. competition begins.  
Sunday's schedule: 8:30 a.m. check-in / warm-up at 8:45 a.m./ competition: 9 a.m.
6. **Lineup Changes – Team Event:** A bowler that starts a game must finish that game. Bowlers can only be switched out between games. If an injury occurs during a game, and the bowler comes out, the USBC injury rule takes precedent and that bowler cannot bowl for the remainder of that session.
7. **One coach only** in bowlers' area. Additional coaches and parents please remain on the concourse level. Only the 5 students bowling each game in the bowling area. Substitutes can be right behind the seating, so please comply. *This will be enforced with a penalty of a 10 pin reduction in team score per occurrence.*
8. Scoring corrections can be made directly by the mutual agreement of the coaches. For any disputes, get Reggie Frederick, Ron Hicks, Bob Hanson, or Daisha Schoolcraft (Kenmore Lanes).
9. Pinsetter or foul line malfunctions may also be resolved by the mutual agreement of the two coaches. For any disputes, see one of the tournament officials
10. Coaches are responsible for maintaining the proper attitude and emotion of their bowlers. Swearing, hitting-kicking equipment will not be tolerated and will result in one warning only. A second occurrence will result in disqualification for the remainder of the competition. This includes being over aggressive with your own teammates regarding noise and disruptions. Coaches should be wearing their USBC Registered Volunteer Badge at all times. Coaches without RVB will NOT be permitted in the bowling area.

11. **Official team shirts**, supplied by the high school or sponsoring bowling center are encouraged for *all bowlers and coaches*. Blue jeans and yoga pants or any type of hats are not permitted during competition. Clean, colored denim apparel is permitted as are hemmed shorts provided all team members are similarly dressed. School names or school mascot are encouraged on the back of all team and coaches' shirts.

12. National anthem on Saturday, then bowling begins.
